Arianna just learned that she was selected for early admittance to Vermont Tech College!!

She'll begin this fall in her senior year of high school

Arianna will be majoring in Professional Pilot Technology. The Professional Pilot Technology program provides flight training courses in cooperation with Vermont Flight Academy at Burlington International Airport. Offered FAA certificates and ratings include: Private, Instrument, Commercial (Single-Engine Land & Sea), Multi-Engine (Land & Sea), and Certified Flight Instructor (Airplane, Instrument, & Multi-Engine). The coursework combines basic and advanced airmanship skills to provide safe operations for all types of flying. In partnership with Vermont Flight Academy, students can expect to complete approximately 250-275 hours of flight time and will become certified flight instructors during their junior year.





Attached are a couple pictures from the ferry flight adventure from Ohio to Nevada (via TX). The purpose of the trip was to pick up an SR22 that one of the two pilots I went with had purchased. Since it was his new toy, he did all of the flying until we got to Pheonix. In Pheonix, we switched to the other pilot's plane, also an SR22, and I flew the last leg up to Las Vegas. The next day, he gave me lessons in the Cirrus and let me fly us around the Vegas area. By the way, I met him through Olga Mitchell - he's a CFII who actually used to be one of her students way back when! It was an amazing flight and I was privileged to get to fly over the Hoover Dam, along the Grand Canyon, and through the Valley of Fire. I did well and was able to earn my high performance endorsement out of it. I was also given access to play in a full motion Cirrus simulator for an hour or so and was able to experience what it's like to use CAPS. It was a great trip! View more photos at:

I recently took a course at Survival Systems USA in Groton, CT which was called "General Emergency Duties" - it covered a variety of topics beyond just underwater egress, such as how to handle fire and smoke in the cockpit, hypoxia recognition, hypothermia mitigation, proper use of a life vest, inflating and boarding a raft, open water survival, and First Aid/CPR/AED. I recommend it to every and any pilot regardless of whether they fly over water frequently or not. I got so much out of it and really came away feeling like a more confident, safe and well-armed pilot and person.
