FAA Awards & Women Pilot History

At the upcoming Sun 'n Fun Aerospace Expo in Lakeland, Florida (April 2020) and EAA AirVenture in Oshkosh, Wisconsin (July 2020), the FAA Safety Team is planning to honor women in aviation by awarding the Wright Brothers Master Pilot and Charles Taylor Master Mechanic Awards to a group of all-female recipients.

Women have had critical roles in founding and furthering the world of aviation. Some **notable** examples of female aviation trailblazers include:

Susan and Katharine Wright, the mother and sister to Orville and Wilbur Wright Emma Todd, first woman to design an airplane Theresa Peltier, first woman to pilot an aircraft Raymonde de Larouche, first woman in the world to receive a pilot's license Bessie Coleman, first African-American/Native-American woman to receive a pilot's license Amelia Earhart, first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic, among other achievements Phoebe Omlie, first female AMT and Airline Transport Pilot Jacqueline Cochran, first woman to break the sound barrier All the Rosie the Riveters, women who helped build aircraft during WWII All the WASPs, civilian female pilots used in WWII serving under military command Geraldine Mock, first woman to fly solo around the world Valentina Tereshkova, first woman in space The 588th Regiment "Night Witches" Emily Warner, first female captain of a scheduled U.S. airline The Mercury 13, female astronaut trainees

We also acknowledge all those who continue the proud tradition of being a woman in aviation, and who are paving the way forward for those women who will help move this industry ahead for many years to come.
