

## **Amelia Earhart Scholarships**

It's Amelia Earhart Memorial Scholarship time!!

The following categories of scholarships are available for 99's who qualify:

- Flight training up to \$20,000
- Academic training up to \$10,000
- Technical training up to \$20,000 for aviation or aerospace technical training
- Emergency maneuver training
- Research scholar grant

The qualifications and application instructions are available on the international website <u>ninety-nines.org</u>.

Applications are due to your chapter by January 1, 2026, but it is best to submit them well in advance so there is adequate time for review and any revisions necessary.

This is one of the most generous scholarships awarded in the pilot community. It is well worth taking the time to apply if you are considering or are involved in training in any of these areas.
